## COVID-19 UPDATE: APRIL 14, 2021

### Epidemiologic Week 15: 4/11/2021 - 4/17/2021

This report is based on only available data; not all results have been received.



San Benito County (SBC) Public Health Services continues to work with medical providers to identify and test individuals who meet criteria for COVID-19 testing. As of April 14, 2021, eight new cases have been reported, for a total of 5,944 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in SBC.

Confirmed cases include patients who have since recovered and those who are deceased. Fifty-three percent (3,150) of positive cases reported were female; ages ranged from 15 days to 101 years (median: 35 years).

All results included in this update are current to April 14, 2021 at 3:00PM.



Community transmission occurs when the source of infection is unknown.


Person-to-person transmission occurs when infection is spread through a confirmed contact. Person-to-person transmission typically occurs in close-contact environments, such as households or workplaces.

Confirmed COVID-19 Cases by Test Date in SBC



SBC COVID-19 Cases by Age Group









### California Blueprint for a Safer Economy

#### TIER 1: WIDESPREAD

- More than 10 daily new cases (per 100k).
- More than 8% positive tests.

#### TIER 2: SUBSTANTIAL

- 6-10 daily new cases (per 100k).
- 5-8% positive tests.

#### TIER 3: MODERATE

- 2-5.9 daily new cases (per 100k).
- 2-4.9% positive tests.

#### TIER 4: MINIMAL

- Less than 2 daily new cases (per 100k).
- Less than 2% positive tests.
