 - People with disabilities- Regina (Public Transportation)

- Discussions from Dot Voting
 - Housing Instability v. Housing Quality
 - Housing Instability: encompasses several challenges, such as having trouble paying rent, overcrowding, moving frequently, or spending the bulk of household income on housing.
 - Housing Quality: refers to the physical condition of a person's home as well as the quality of the social and physical environment in which the home is located.
 - Environmental Conditions
 - Sidewalks and Pedestrians > Can be seen as an issue in commercial areas along highway 25, next to the new businesses.
 - Access to Dental Services
 - Health Care shortage (In dental)
 - Medi-cal Patients may have to seek medical attention out of county due to the lack of dental services.
 - People with disabilities or having a child with disabilities.
 - Social Cohesion
 - How well an area or group with come together to solve a problem.
 - Commuters may not be as engaged since most want to spend their weekends resting.
 - Childhood Obesity (Early childhood development and access to health services)
 - Funding being cut from P.E teachers.
 - More afterschool programs.

- Sports programs are offered but families may be not able to afford them.
- More educational programs about why it is important to exercise.
- More programs to help children get involved with sports/exercise.
- Children that come from commuting families miss out on the after-school programs, sports, and other exercise activities.
- Access to healthy food/Food insecurity
 - San Benito County has lots of grocery stores with lots of healthy foods and produce.
 - CalFresh Healthy living has observed that over 50% of San Benito County restaurants are fast food.
 - Families commuting out of town may settle for fast food at the end of day due to being tired.
 - People that use public transportation have a disadvantage because they can only buy what they can carry. Limits them.
