

The CSEC 102 training provides an advanced and comprehensive curriculum on best practices for serving youth that are commercially sexually exploited. This CDSS sponsored training is free to all California based providers in any setting — child welfare, juvenile justice, healthcare, social work, education, and more.

CSEC 102 TRAINING

- Describe practices and interventions to support exploited youth at different stages of change.
- Describe the ways complex trauma impacts behavior, health, help-seeking and general engagement and healing of youth impacted by sexual exploitation.
- Discuss trauma informed care (TIC) principles as they apply to work with exploited youth.
- Providers that complete the 4 day, 16 hour training are invited to optional monthly **Learning Communities** for additional CSEC support.

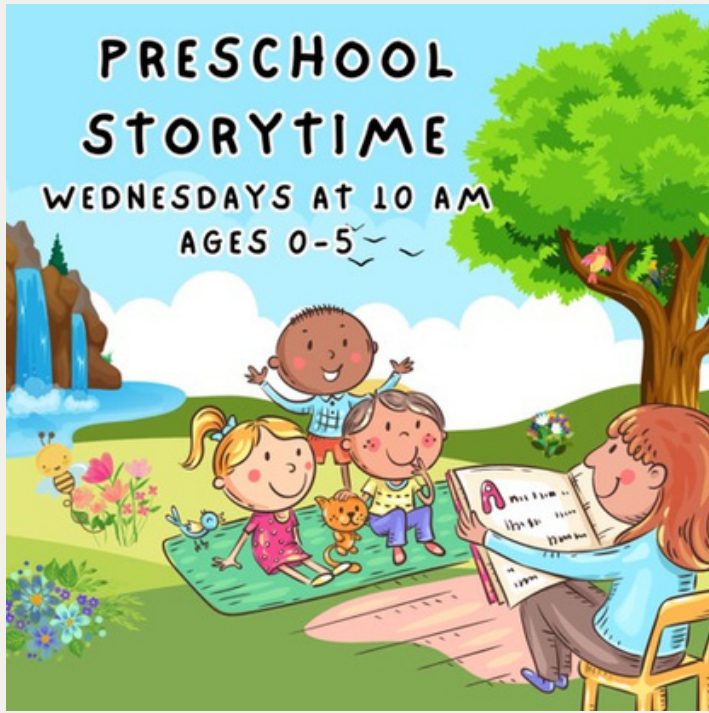
Children Entering Care: Physical Health Issues

RESOURCE FAMILY APPROVAL

THE RESOURCE FAMILY APPROVAL (RFA) PROGRAM IS A FAMILY-FRIENDLY AND CHILD-CENTERED CAREGIVER APPROVAL PROCESS THAT COMBINES ELEMENTS OF THE PREVIOUS FOSTER PARENT LICENSING, RELATIVE APPROVAL, AND APPROVALS FOR ADOPTION AND GUARDIANSHIP PROCESSES AND REPLACES THOSE PROCESSES. RESOURCE FAMILIES PROVIDE PLACEMENT FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND YOUNG ADULTS (NON-MINOR DEPENDENTS FROM 18-21 YEARS OLD) WHO ARE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE JUVENILE COURT, OR OTHERWISE IN THE CARE OF A COUNTY CHILD WELFARE AGENCY OR PROBATION DEPARTMENT. SAN BENITO COUNTY RESOURCE FAMILIES ARE GIVEN THE UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY TO SUPPORT THE CHILDREN AND FAMILIES IN OUR COMMUNITY. BY ALLOWING OUR CHILDREN TO STAY LOCALLY, EACH CHILD IS GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO CONTINUE ATTENDING HIS OR HER SCHOOL, MAINTAIN SOCIAL AND FAMILIAL RELATIONSHIPS AND THRIVE IN FAMILIAR SURROUNDINGS AT A TIME WHEN HIS OR HER LIFE IS UNCERTAIN. THE RESOURCE FAMILY PLAYS A VITAL ROLE IN THE SUCCESS OF A CHILD.

RESOURCE FAMILY ROLE

THE ROLE OF A RESOURCE FAMILY IS TO DEMONSTRATE EXCELLENCE IN PARENTING IN A NURTURING, SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT WHILE PREPARING THE FOSTER CHILD FOR REUNIFICATION WITH HIS OR HER BIRTH FAMILY. RESOURCE FAMILIES ARE PART OF A TEAM WHO SUPPORTS THE CHILD BY EMBRACING ALL MEMBERS OF THE CHILD'S LIFE, OFTEN PROVIDING SUPPORT TO THE CHILD'S BIOLOGICAL FAMILY, ACTING AS A LIFELONG CONNECTION TO PROMOTE A HEALTHY AND POSITIVE CHANGE. THIS ALLOWS THE RESOURCE FAMILY TO PROMOTE STABILITY AND PERMANENCE FOR THE CHILD THROUGHOUT HIS OR HER LIFE. WHEN REUNIFICATION WITH THE BIRTH FAMILY IS NOT POSSIBLE, THE RESOURCE FAMILY PREPARES THE CHILD FOR THE NEXT STEPS OF PERMANENCY, WHICH MAY INCLUDE ADOPTION.
